At ÉOES we strive to be a place where students feel safe, cared for and connected to the adults in the building. It is when we have achieved this that we can begin to create an environment where children can flourish in their understanding of their ability to positively contribute to their classroom and school, their family, and community.

Through many experiences, students develop into thoughtful, caring, and compassionate citizens. In our Social Studies program, citizenship is one of the core concepts embedded into every grade level K to 12. In phys ed and health, we learn how to care for ourselves and each other. Through the stories we read and write, we learn about struggles and how to overcome them, and through classes like phys ed and activities during recess, students learn how to play, deal with conflict, and work as a team.

At ÉOES, we continue to provide opportunities for students to learn and contribute to our community and our world beyond the curriculum. Meaningful lessons, such as how to gracefully win or lose a game during our floor hockey tournament, or helping a fellow student score that basket, find their lost boots or make a new friend, take place each and every day. INCLEMENT WEATHER DAYS

Parents of bus students: please contact your school to confirm if your child will be absent on Yellow Days. It is imperative that parents are familiar with our Inclement Weather protocols (which are available on our school website and the division website). To ensure the highest safety, parents are reminded that on a Yellow Day (meaning that buses are not running, but schools are open and classes are being held), our school still requires you to contact us if your child will be absent. Some parents may choose to drive their child into the school, while some parents will choose to keep their child at home that day – we can't make assumptions when safety is at stake.

THE COLD IS HERE

With the soon-to-be cold weather coming, it is very important that all children come appropriately dressed for the conditions. Please ensure students are arriving with winter boots, pants, jackets, hats and mitts to protect them from the cold.

Bus students - it is very important to have all winter gear when riding the bus. We want to ensure, in the event a bus breaks down and students must sit for any time without heat, all of our students are prepared for the weather. This winter gear includes winter boots, pants, jackets, hats and mitts as well.

Remember - we are outside at recess unless the ambient weather or windchill drops to below -21c! Thank you for helping us keep warm!

Morning Drop Off

- Morning bell rings at 8:35am. Students can be dropped off at the school no earlier than 8:25am and head towards their classroom meeting area.
- If you will be later than 8:40am, please have your child use the front entrance, as all other doors will be locked.

After School Pick Up

All students will be dismissed at 3:10pm. Students will exit to their predetermined meeting spots, buses or walk home.

Students cannot travel hallways to pick up siblings. These meetings will need to take place outside.



In November we had our first two assemblies. Our staff were all so proud of our students as they were so respectful, quiet and well-behaved during the **Remembrance Day assembly**. The grade 4 classes also did an amazing job of their poem and song. It was truly a beautiful ceremony to honor our veterans.

Our school was also able to enjoy a wonderful production of **Jack and the Beanstalk** performed by the Alberta Musical Theatre Company. After the show, all of the grade 1 to 4 students drew a picture of their favorite part and these have all been sent to the cast and crew of the show.

In December we will have two more assemblies in the gym. The first one will be on Tuesday, December 20 when we will see the grade 1 students perform "The Littlest Christmas Tree". You can come and watch their show at 1:15 or at 6:00. This light-hearted performance will be sure to get you into the Christmas spirit! You are also invited to join the students at 2:30 on Friday, December 23 for a whole school Christmas carol singalong. We haven't been able to enjoy this festive tradition for the last several years so we are all really looking forward to singing together once again.



December 2022 - Mr. Kish: Physical Education Update

Curriculum - Physical Education Classes become more challenging this term as we focus on using objects (manipulatives) to learn new skills. The activities will help improve our coordination and physical literacy skills. We will also take our fitness challenges up a notch by trying more complex exercises and for longer durations.

Grades 2,3,4 - Sticks and ball skills. We have been learning how to control a hockey ball using stick handling techniques in a zone and also moving in the gym. Students have been practicing how to shoot a "snapshot" and "wrist shot" for accuracy. Players use the good sport "N-H-L" face-off and play keep away to demonstrate their skills. We are playing 4-goal hockey games and also full-on, full gym hockey with goalies and Teams.

Grade 4 - Floor Hockey Intramurals (It's a Tradition!!). Grade 4's that were interested in playing floor hockey against other grade 4 teams could sign up and be on a Team. We have 4 Boys Teams and 3 Girls Teams who will be playing games at Lunch Recess times for the next few months.

Grade 1 - Ball Skills and Stick Skills. We have been learning how to use a rubber ball safely in the gym. Skills include; bouncing (dribbling) in our own space and also moving around the gym, throwing the ball against the wall and catching it, and shooting the ball into the basketball hoops for a score. We have also been learning how to use a floor hockey stick with a soft ball. Running safely with a stick, and using it properly to stick handle and shoot is a key requirement in order to play a floor hockey game.

Grade 1 - Fitness. Students have been challenging themselves to complete an exercise video which focuses on strength, balance, coordination, and cardiovascular fitness.

Kindergarten - Ball Skills. We have been learning how to use a rubber ball safely in the gym. Students have been practicing with their ball to learn the difference between Drop and catch, Bounce and catch, and Throw and catch. We are also doing one-minute concentration challenges to see if we can sustain one minute of practice without getting distracted or start talking to each other.

Kindergarten Fitness. We have been enjoying a fun follow along exercise video at the start of every class to warm us up and practice coordination, stretching, and balance.

Proper Gym Footwear

Please ensure your child can participate in our Gym Activities by following a few basic rules about the Footwear you provide;

- 1. Fancy Boots (especially with high heels) are not appropriate
- 2. Slippers are not for the Gym
- 3. Shoes should be proper size and STAY on the FEET
- 4. If your child cannot tie laces then please use velcro shoes or teach your child to tie laces

Would parents please consider checking in with your child about their shoes and if necessary having your child bring home their Indoor Shoes for an inspection. You might be surprised how they are "wearing or not wearing their shoes"...?
