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#### Student Safety and Security at ÉOES

Did you know that we have over 500 students registered at École Olds Elementary School? Accompanying these students are teachers and support staff, who work together to make our school a safe and caring place for children to learn. The safety of all people attending our school is of the utmost importance and we are always reflecting and tweaking our process, working to make things even better. Here are a few of the steps that we take at ÉOES to address this:

- Supervision: Outside supervision begins at 8:25am and staff is stationed at each designated door welcoming students into the school. We also ensure someone is on the cross-walk and bus area (before and after school). Recesses throughout the day are supervised by staff assigned to specific zones throughout the playground to ensure students can always find someone in a vest. Except for days that the track is opened with permission by Mr. Kish, students stay and play between the school and the track area knowing the boundaries of the school grounds.
- Roadway: We encourage all adults and students to use the designated crosswalk when parking on the north side of the street. It is important that we continue to be safe, even when we are sometimes in a rush. Our roadway is a busy one before, and after school. Please ensure you are following traffic signs and watching for little and big people. The morning sun is sometimes right in the driver's eyes so we often remind our littles (& bigs) to not cross the road until directed to do so by those on crossing guard duty.
- Parking Lots: Each day before and after school, we close the gates to the parking lot in front of the school. We ask drivers who have vehicles in this lot to stay parked and to wait until the gates are opened by school staff before moving your vehicle. We know this is not convenient and ask that if you need to leave quickly in the morning or afternoon, to please park on the street. We do this because of the large number of students, parents and little brothers/sisters that end up walking in this space. We also ask that our families not use the east parking lot to walk through as there are vehicles moving in and out of parking spaces during the busy before and after school times. We do have a few accessible parking spots marked in our front parking lot, and on the street. Please park where appropriate.
- Security Plan: Our school security plan informs all staff of the procedures to be followed for fire drills, lockdowns, tornado safety, first aid treatment and emergency evacuations. We practice these drills and evacuations at various times throughout each year. Parents will be informed if there is ever a need to use one of our security plans beyond a practice drill.
- **Curriculum Content**: The concept of safety is integrated into the curriculum. For example, in PE students are coached on how to play safely and in the health curriculum, personal safety is a topic at all grade levels.
- Special Programs: Every opportunity is taken to provide students with safety education. Safety programs in cooperation with the Olds Fire Department, the RCMP, and the Chinook's Edge Transportation Department are examples of people who provide our school safety programming and who support the community safety of our students.

We appreciate and want to thank the additional layer of safety and security that comes in the form of the moms, dads, grandparents and relatives, who visit our school grounds each morning and afternoon. When it comes to safety, there is no doubt that we benefit from raising our children in a close-knit rural community like Olds.

## Family School Wellness program - support for students A message from Superintendent Kurt Sacher

During the 2022/23 school year there have been more than 11,000 individual sessions with students and a Chinook's Edge Family School Wellness (FSW) Worker. That's about 10% more than last year, and this year is not yet complete.

Coming out of the pandemic, school divisions all over the country are seeing an impact on students who are experiencing challenges with social and emotional wellness, including difficulty adjusting to the pace of learning, and difficulty with social connection.

Chinook's Edge is serious about responding to this challenge. One layer of the many supports we offer is the Family School Wellness program.

#### What is a family school wellness worker?

- Chinook's Edge employs 25 Family School Wellness (FSW) workers.
- FSW workers have expertise and • qualifications in youth wellness
- While all of our Chinook's Edge staff are charged with helping students holistically -FSW workers have a unique opportunity to support your child one-on-one focused on their social and emotional needs.

#### What students see FSW workers?

- The top 3 reasons Chinook's Edge students were referred to FSW last year:
  - 0 Emotional regulation - experiencing anxiety, sadness, and /or anger
  - Relationship challenges with peers at  $\circ$ school / school conflict
  - Family relationship challenges 0
- The criteria for a student to see FSW is that their challenge is impacting them at school

#### How does a student get referred to FSW?

- Students are referred to FSW through a teacher, a principal, or their parents. Students can self refer.
- Every student can access one single session and a follow up session without parental consent. After the single and follow up session, FSW requires parental consent.
- With parental consent, the FSW provides short term support where students have access to about 6 to 8 sessions as needed.

#### What happens in a session with FSW?

- The FSW works one-on-one with a student to resolve mild to moderate social / emotional needs impacting them at school. (Students with severe needs are referred to other professionals).
- If there is more than one session required, FSW workers reach out to families not only for consent, but in order to work together with the family to support the needs of their students.

In surveys after sessions, participants tell us the program is making a significant difference for them. School based administrators and other staff also see the positive impact. I would like to express my gratitude to our Family School Wellness Workers for the dedicated work they are doing, and the difference they make for so many students. All of these qualities are within us and developed through the horses! Partnering with horses and a trained facilitator builds on our self-awareness, confidence


and character through the development of open communication skills, mindfulness and focus, the importance of appropriate body language and the expression of honest and authentic emotions.
