## Physical Education Update From Mr. Kish - April 2024

The Month of April will be a busy month as we transition from Winter and move into Spring....

#### Parent Council Supports our Gym Program !!! - It's NEW! "9 Square In The Air"

OES has been blessed to have a very proactive Parent Council and our students will once again benefit from The PC with a NEW piece of equipment for the gym. There is an exciting game called "9 Square in The Air " that teaches volleyball skills for all ages. I learned about this game and played it last fall and am so excited our OES students are going to experience it! The game can be adjusted depending on age and skill level. It is a Cooperative Game for kids to learn volleyball skills and have fun doing it! I am looking forward to introducing the game this month to the students and showcasing it to parents before the end of year on Sports Day.

#### Swimming - Olds Aquatic Center



All students grades 1-4 take swimming lessons as part of their Physical Education Curriculum. At Olds Elementary we believe swimming is a Life Skill and a necessary skill for Safety. Students are bussed from OES to The Olds Aquatic Center every Tuesday and Thursday during their scheduled times. Parents are welcome to watch! Please follow Olds Aquatic Guidelines for spectating. Teachers will be requesting any prior Swim Lesson Information you may have kept for the Pool Instructors to use when they set up groupings for instruction. Students will receive 6 lessons. The Grade 4's have completed their lessons. The following timelines for grades 1,2,3 swimming are;

Grade 3 - March 19 to April 4

Grade 2 - April 23 to May 9

Grade 1 - May 14 to May 30

#### **Basketball Skills and Shooting Competition**



As part of our Phys Ed Curriculum for Ball Skills students in grades 2, 3, and 4 will participate in a Class Free Throw Shooting Competition. Grade 1 students do a Team Shooting Challenge in preparation for next year. I believe that competition is good for students, it builds resilience, grit, coping skills, and is a necessary part of growing up. The Basketball Shooting Competition has been a tradition for over 20 years fostering competitive spirit and good sportsmanship.

#### Curriculum - what's coming up

In April students will perfect their Skipping Skills with the Short Rope and learn how to do Team Long Rope Skipping. We will also explore Hula Hooping Skills and then we will pursue Lacrosse Skills. (Please note that OES does not allow Lacrosse Sticks on the Playground at this time). The month of May will have us outside again followed by the kids favorite Mission Impossible Challenge Course, Sports Day, and then Gymnastics and Soccer will round out the year. It goes fast!

#### Lunchtime Basketball and Activities (grade 3 and 4)

I have invited grade 3 and 4 students to the gym at lunch time for the next 4 weeks to enjoy some activities, make friends, and hang out since Spring just doesn't seem to want to arrive! The activities available include basketball, climbing, skipping, and hula hoops (in no particular order). Each grade group will get 2 weeks of drop in on a rotation. This week the grade 3's really seemed to enjoy their time together, next week the grade 4's will discover the fun of having the whole gym to hang with friends and socialize. Gym time is a good way to help kids learn social skills and make friends.

#### Grade 4 Floor Hockey - The Champions have been Crowned.

All grade 4 Floor Hockey Teams have battled hard this winter in their League games and the Top Teams made it to a Play-Off Round. The action was exciting and the competition was fierce. Players showed good Sportsmanship and battled hard each game. The goaltending was exceptional this year and it made for some exciting finishes. The Girls Championship Game was played on March 20th between The Aqua-Knights and The Grizz Girls. The battle was intense and the game swayed back and forth with great effort displayed by both teams. The game was deadlocked at 1-1 with goals by Louisa Wells for the Aqua Knights and Willow James for The Grizz Girls. Both goalies were making unbelievable saves making it difficult to score. Sensing that a Championship was at stake and that time was running out, The Aqua Knights powered up and began to put more pressure on the Grizz Girls which led to the breakout goal by Rae Ogilvie and a goal from Power Forward Ava Mcknight. As time was winding down the deal was sealed with another goal by Rae and the game ended 4-1 for The Aqua Knights. Both goalies were Stars of the Game; Violet Jones for The Aqua Knights and Mila Gustafson for The Grizz Girls.

The Boys Championship Game was played on March 21st between The Black Knights and The Bananas. The Bananas won the League Round and came into the game as the team to beat. The Black Knights were up to the challenge and put pressure on the Bananas in the early minutes of the game but were unable to get a shot past the star goalie and MVP Lowen Ross. The Bananas struck soon after with goals by their star snipers and future OES Floor Hockey Hall Of Famers Jace Haaland and Talan Koksol which seemed to rattle the Black Knights confidence. The Bananas got stronger as the game went on and using their hockey experience were able to overpower The Black Knights and win the game by a landslide 14 -1.

The Aqua Knights and The Bananas earned the right to play the Teachers and Staff in a Floor Hockey Exhibition in front of the school .... A tradition that is anticipated year after year! We have scheduled the Teacher Versus Students games for the morning of April 5th, and welcome parents and friends to watch.

#### Proper Gym Footwear - the struggle is real...
